## President's Message: Earl Duckett



With this letter, I want to explore two subjects. First, a change to the 2019 map schedule and second to discuss opportunities to volunteer at the Arts In Hand gallery.

At a recent meeting, the Arts In Hand Board made a decision not to print the 2019 edition of the Gallery Map. What we found out by creating the 2017 and 2018 Gallery Map editions was that it takes a tremendous amount of volunteer hours to produce an edition of this map. We have to find an easier way to do this. We have been in negotiations with a couple companies that can take the entire process of selling advertisements and signing up galleries which is the lion's share of the work. Unfortunately, by the time we figured out that we could do this a different way, it was too late to get it done for 2019. Consequently, we decided to skip a year. We will continue to distribute the 2018 map thru calendar 2019. We have enough printed copies to do that.

The other thing we are working on is making improvements to the Arts In Hand gallery. The focus is on increasing sales and making the gallery more profitable. The questions are: How do we make the gallery more inviting? Can we spruce up the outside generating more interest for customers to explore what is on the inside? How do we make shopping easier? Can we change the layout, the lighting, add more fixtures and display stands? Can we be open more hours, more days, both during the tourist season as well as throughout the year? Can we make it easier to change out artwork, add artists or add artists work? Can we get more involved with the community, and how do we get more involved in the community? If you have any ideas on how to make improvements at the gallery, please let me know.

With the focus on the gallery and making improvements, there is a lot to do. We already have a great group of volunteers and a dedicated Gallery committee, but we need more help. If you are looking for the opportunity to get involved with a great group of people and become part of something greater than yourself, now is the time to volunteer. ### Artist's North Woods Retreat at Forest Lodge on Lake Namakagon

#### September 26 to 28, 2018

Join professional artists Diana Randolph and Jan Wise for this artist's retreat nestled among the old-growth trees at Forest Lodge on Lake Namakagon in Cable, Wisconsin. You'll observe, explore and interpret the pristine lake and forest environment of this unique north woods retreat using various drawing materials. We'll work outdoors and on the upstairs level of a beautiful boat house that juts out onto the lake.

With Diana you'll focus on the art elements of line, value, texture and space on the first day. You'll use pencil, black & white conte crayons, and water soluble (gray) pencils. On the second morning you'll explore the natural world of vibrant color using waterproof drawing pen and watercolor pencils.

On the second afternoon and third day, Jan will coach you to stretch your senses and imagination as you bridge your inner world to the outer, natural world as you create fun art projects. You'll connect with the wonders of nature in a unique way.

### Fall Meander—September 28-30

Fall Splendor Art Meander is a self-guided tour of nineteen galleries and studios in eleven towns and villages during the fall color change. Cities and villages included are Spooner, Shell Lake, Sarona, Cumberland, Rice Lake, Cameron, Chetek, Turtle Lake and Dallas along and just off US Highways 63 and 53. Maps are available at participating venues and sponsors and online/facebook.

This event is in its 9th year with several artists giving demonstrations, tours of studios and living spaces and some of the retail sponsors will also host artists as well as poets and musicians who will be performing at select locations. The Art Meander gives visibility to some of the region's most experienced artists and introduces many emerging creatives to tourists and residents alike. The Fall Splendor Art Meander was established when a small band of accomplished artists combined their efforts and organized an art crawl during the beautiful autumn color change.
