### Gail Threinen-Chinese Brush Painting

Bio: While living in Singapore and China, Gail fell in love with the Asian style of painting as well as Chinese Calligraphy. She is a member of the Sumi-e Society of America and the International Chinese Calligraphy And Ink Painting Society. She has exhibited and won awards nationally as well as internationally. She won Best In Show in the Sumi-e Society of America's National Juried Exhibition in 2019. Gail has been an Arts In Hand Gallery Member Artist since 2016 and her hand painted greeting cards are one of our customer favorites.

Gail uses the spontaneous style of Chinese Brush Painting which is about personal expression rather than about accuracy or detail. It is about allowing the brush to flow, which is satisfying and expressive. Compared to western painting styles, Chinese brush painting is typically more free and dynamic. ### Deborah Stull-Kinsley - Watercolors

Whether setting up an easel outdoors or in her studio, Deborah is deeply influenced by a *sense of place*. This value of "place" is grounded in the agrarian roots of her grandparents and in her own experience, years ago, of raising sheep, goats and a llama on a farm in North Dakota. A few years ago, Deborah and her husband, Paul, moved to northern Wisconsin, renovated a neglected cabin and now live, work and create art in a vibrant lake community. Today, she enjoys "playing with color" and painting watercolors in her Wild River Arts studio.

A favorite activity is to take roadtrips and follow the "blue roads" - those lesser-traveled routes that may reveal hidden gems or spectacular vistas. Her paintings often reflect these scenes - from picturesque farms and prairies, to incredible landscapes of the North Country, to the rugged sights of the Wild Atlantic Way in Ireland. 

#### Class Overview

If you are an absolute beginner in exploring art and would like to try using a brush, or if you are an expert in another form of art, you will have fun in this class. Gail uses the spontaneous style of Chinese Brush Painting which is about personal expression rather than about accuracy or detail. It is about allowing the brush to flow, which is satisfying and expressive. Compared to western painting styles, Chinese brush painting is typically more free and dynamic. Backgrounds are usually omitted, with the balance between the object and white space being a particular artistic feature. This workshop will cover the basic traditional Chinese brush techniques using the uniquely-shaped Chinese brush, ink, and pigments on rice (xuan) paper. In Chinese art and culture, a flower is never merely a flower nor scenery merely a place; each has its legends, romantic stories, and symbolic spirituality. Gail lived in China and then spent many years as a docent at the Minneapolis Museum of Art specializing in the China galleries and includes fun stories and insight into the subjects you will be painting. Those subjects will include florals, animals or insects and some simple landscapes.

Bio: While living in Singapore and China, Gail fell in love with the Asian style of painting as well as Chinese Calligraphy. She has been studying and practicing these arts now for 20 years and is well respected among her peers. She enjoys teaching in person to share the fun of this art. She is a member of the Sumi-e Society of America and the International Chinese Calligraphy And Ink Painting Society. She has exhibited and won awards nationally as well as internationally. She won Best In Show in the Sumi-e Society of America's National Juried Exhibition in 2019. Gail has been an Arts In Hand Gallery Member Artist since 2016 and her hand painted greeting cards are one of our customer favorites.

Please bring with you:


Three or four white porcelain dinner plates to use as a paint pallet. (Something from a second hand store is great)

A brush-washing water container like a pickle jar or such

A roll of paper towels

Two small paper weights or any 2 small objects to act as paper weights (small smooth rocks work well)

An apron since the ink and pigments used are very permanent.

This class will offer an introduction to watercolor painting! After a brief overview of watercolor techniques, composition and design, learning will occur as Deborah demonstrates a variety of techniques for applying paint to paper and the students paint along at the same time. The class will focus on various aspects of watercolors as well as explore brushes, papers, paint quality, mixing colors and splattering. Be prepared to complete one 8" x 10" painting.

Deborah Stull-Kinsley enjoys watercolor painting in her northwestern Wisconsin studio. She is inspired by the landscapes around her - from picturesque farms and prairies, to the scenic Northwoods, to the rugged sights of Ireland. A lifelong learner, Deb pursued a variety of creative art - from drawing as a child to education courses in pottery, fiber arts and loom weaving. For the past several years, she's focused on watercolor and loves the transparency and fluidity of this medium - the way the colors interact and every piece may bring a sense of surprise. There will be a final class on Tues, August 23, from 10-noon when students will prepare and embellish their fused vase with ribbon, rope and beads for hanging. Students will take home their vases that day upon completion of the class.
